## Dear Members,

You are indeed a valued and unique group of people. Of all the residents and friends of Freedom, you are one of only 10% of our population who belong to the Historical Society. Of course, some of you live elsewhere and still generously support us. We have 108 members so far this year, up 54% over last year's membership. And, membership income is better too. I am pleased to report that we are, so far, on-target to reach our 2012 income budget of \$8,600. So we are making progress thanks to you!!

Beyond membership we have many positives this year that I would like to report to you.

1. The Society's 2012 programs have been a big hit so far! The "Art of the White Mountains" was excellent and scholarly-we all learned something. The "Fire of 1947" drew a crowd of about 100 people, which is a record-breaker for the Society, I believe. And the personal stories and recollections of the fires in Freedom were all videotaped for posterity. It was nice to see Effingham and Madison residents present. In case you have forgotten, here is the list of the remaining programs (don't miss out!):

You can start collecting new photos for 2014 calendar now since the contest committee has announced the theme already: "Freedom Community": Submit photographs that capture the character and beauty of Freedom's community including aspects of family life depicted in events and seasonal pastimes. The deadline for submittal will be announced later.

- 3. Most buildings & grounds repair tasks left over from last year (roof, chimney and window leaks, re-surfaced driveway, etc.) have been completed and the place is looking good. Beyond the roof painting, which will be done professionally, we have one more task to finish. On July 13 & 14, we will have a volunteer party to paint the north side of the Allard house. Please come and help if you are able.
- 4. The Freedom Elementary School kids visited us on June 11<sup>th</sup> for a tour of four areas of the house and barn. The kids (kindergarten, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grades) and our 4 volunteer docents (Board members) all had a great time- and we all learned something. 5. The museum collection in the Works Barn is now being labeled and entered into our Past Perfect software database which includes a photo of each item. This will be a slow process (have you seen how many items are in the barn!?). This process has already been done for the collection in the Allard House (over 1,000 items). Check out the many notebooks in the Freedom Public Library (thanks to Ed Boyer and others) if you want a glimpse of what is recorded. The expectation is that, once complete, anyone can come into the Society and do research by item type, name, or collection category. We are trying to make Freedom's wonderful museum accessible and useful to all.

- 6. Our 2012 11-member Board is doing very well with focusing on the Society's mission and making improvements. We have maintained a near 100% attendance at all monthly board meetings, so you can see that the group is committed. In case you have forgotten who they are: Bonnie Burroughs, Gale Morris, Dotty Brooks, Scott Cunningham, Art Robinson, Sylvia Carney, Ellen Many, Dick Many, Nadine Chapman, Tom Luke and John Shipman. They, and our volunteers, are the energy that keeps things going.
- 7. We would like to announce at this time an exciting (and tasty!) fundraising event. The Society is raffling off tickets for a fine New England "comfort food" dinner for <u>four</u> with all the fixin's, to be held in the Allard house dining room. **"So what can I do?"** Your membership does so much to help us, but of course we always have needs. These include:

- **Tell a friend or neighbor** about the Society and ask them to join. This would be a great help and aid us enormously.
- **Help with items not in our budget.** This year's spring cleaning went very well, but we found that several curtains in the house had deteriorated to the point where they must be replaced. Some UV shades we use to protect the collection are in similar condition. We need between \$400 and \$500 to remedy this problem. Included at the end of this letter is a form you can submit to help us out with these non-budgeted needs.
- Help us with the collection. Identify and enter the Works barn collection into the Society's database. It is not difficult and we have a methodology -- what we need are people with attention to detail, rudimentary computer skills, and/or knowledge about tools (be part of a team).
